July 1 – Folk and Jazz: Karen Mal and Will Taylor (Austin, Texas)



Karen Mal and Will Taylor are Strings Attached. He's jazz; she's folk. Together they weave music that's sophisticated and old-fashioned at the same time. Her playful and sensual vocals, his Gypsy virtuosic violin, with four instruments between them.

Karen's won top songwriting awards from the Wildflower Arts and Music Festival (Texas), the Tucson Folk Festival (Arizona), and has been a three-time New Folk Finalist at Kerrville (Texas). Will is an award-winning violinist who has played with such musicians as Pearl Jam and Willie Nelsen. You will delight in the music they bring to Crooked Creek



July 8 - Jimmy Stadler Band (Taos)



Jimmy Stadler realized he was meant to be a musician when he sat down to the piano at a very young age....

...By 17, Jimmy was on the road with his band and over the last 45 years has performed in nearly every state, with many well known artists. Keyboards, guitars, mandolin are among the instruments he brings to his shows. Accompanying on bass and vocals is David Toland; Mark Clark plays drums and sings. Together the Jimmy Stadler Band has won "Best of Taos" in various categories every year since the late 1990's. Playing over 200 shows each year, their performances include original music and familiar songs.





July 15 – String Quartet with Rebecca Caron of Taos Soundscapes

Cellist Rebecca Caron has assembled a string quartet program for each of the Crooked Creek Concert seasons. Previous years' programs have included the works of Tchaikovsky, Mendelssohn, Schubert, Bach, Corelli, and Joaquin Turina. This year's concert will feature Dvorak's Opus 61 and Mozart's Divertimento K.136, plus a Tango or two! Joining her this year will be Kay Newnam (violin), Catherine Pope (violin) and Danny de Santis (viola). It's an incredible experience to listen to the classics surrounded by the beauty of the Taos mountains.
